HARINGEY FIRST WORLD WAR PEACE FORUM

Annual Report October 2017 – October 2018

Since the last AGM in October 2017 the core planning group has met on twelve occasions - 15 November 2017, 13 December, 8 January 2018, 29 January, 7 February, 14 March, 23 April, 23 May, 13 June, 9July, 20 August and 25 September.

The programme of work has largely been determined by the projects itemised in the Heritage Lottery Fund bid for £9,900 that was granted in September 2017. We are immensely grateful for this HLF grant which is enabling us to put our 'Conscientious Objection Remembered' programme into effect. The simple listing below of our activities disguises many hours of work by the core group to research, liaise, arrange, and complete them. This was especially true of *The Lost Files* sculpture, the newly created website, and our booklet *Conscientious Objection Remembered*. Our mailing list of local supporters and press has grown, and they have been contacted at least six times with news of progress and events.

We have had encouraging responses from local press and various networks, both historical and peace related. *The Tottenham and Wood Green Independent* carried a front page photograph and short article following the project's launch in December 2017, the *Ham & High* also included a photograph and a report. *The Lost Files* sculpture was publicised through *Haringey People* and featured in the June 2018 issue of *The Friend* while the walk booklet, *Conscientious Objection Remembered*, was treated to a full page spread in the October/November 2018 issue of *Peace News*. Talks and presentations by members of the core group have been followed in various ways and several are likely to lead to future opportunities for publicity. So, for example, Jennifer Bell's talk on 'WW1 Conscientious Objectors in Haringey' resulted in an article published in *Haringey CND Newsletter*. Similarly, a presentation at Layers of London events (see below) resulted in one of the COs from our project featuring on their website home page (https://www.layersoflondon.org) and a Layers of London article featured HFWWPF in the Institute of Historical Research journal *Past & Future* in April.

Our regular contributions to the Institute of Historical Research's project, 'Layers of London', by using the map to plot our COs, resulted in HFWWPF being given as an example at a Layers of London workshop on 24 May
